AKC CODE OF SPORTSMANSHIP

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

Trial Scheduling Information

These trials will run CONCURRENTLY.

Concurrent trials allow us to ideally schedule your 2 runs in 4 hours or less! Two runs with a fresh dog instead of a sleepy, stiff, tired dog that's spent hours in a crate waiting for a PM trial to start.

Additionally, it allows us to accommodate more exhibitors in our parking lot. By getting exhibitors in/out in the morning, parking for other exhibitors opens up in the afternoon.

It does not matter if your run in Trial 2 happens before your run in Trial 1.

There can be no day-of transfers (move ups) once the trials start. If you Q in one trial, <u>a transfer (move up) is not possible</u> for the other trial. This is because the transfer form must be received before the trial starts. Since they both start at the same time you cannot Q in one trial then move up at the next.

The Highest Combined Score in Open B and Utility B Classes awards are determined by classes within the same trial.

Multiple dogs + multiple classes + one handler = conflicts. Conflicts will be handled the day of the show.

To help you visualize how concurrent trials work, one possible schedule is below.

Dogs Eligible to Enter / Participate

This trial is open to all dogs over the age of six (6) months that are registered with the American Kennel Club (including mixed breeds) or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or are an approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breed.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs disfigured as the result of accident or injury but otherwise qualified shall be eligible provided that the disfigurement does not interfere with functional movement. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible. Blind means without useful vision. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged or in any way has anything attached to it for medical purposes.

Bitches in season shall not be eligible to participate. Entry fees for bitches in season may be refunded at the club's option. The premium list must state whether refunds will be issued for bitches in season. Please see **Refund Section.**

Move - Ups

Move-ups are due to the trial secretary **before the published closing date for this trial** (October 18, 2023). Move-ups should be sent through regular mail or e-mail and should include the following information:

ENTRY FEE: \$33.00 for the first Obedience entry of a dog; \$27.00 for the second Obedience entry of the same dog, **same trial.** Each trial is a separate event so a first entry fee applies to each

CLOSING DATE: Wednesday, October 18, 2023 at 5:00 p.m., after which entries cannot be accepted, cancelled or substituted except as provided for in Chapter 11, Section 6 of the Dog Show Rules. MAIL ALL ENTRIES to PCOTC c/o Theresa Nolan, 503 Sylvan Ave., Bayport, NY 11705. If you send overnight delivery, please remember to sign the signature waiver.

ENTRY FEES shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Trial Committee. If because of

riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management, it is impossible to open or to complete the trial, no refund of entry fees will be made except as noted in the COVID-19 guidelines and procedures and waiver.

REFUNDS: There shall be no refunds for entries withdrawn in the event a dog and/or handler are absent or dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for such dismissal. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of management it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry fee will be made.

BITCHES IN SEASON are not eligible to participate. Entry fees will be refunded subject to a \$5.00 processing fee. Written verification from a veterinarian is required. Notification for refund of bitches in season must be RECEIVED in writing no later than 48 hrs. after end of the trial. A Veterinarian's note must accompany any such refund noification.

ERRORS ON ENTRY BLANKS-Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after trial has closed.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF ENTRIES will be made by as soon as the trial closes.

Confirmations will be via email either as an attachment or in the body of an email to all exhibitors who provide their email address. If you do not have an email address and want a confirmation, please send a stamped self-addressed envelope. Final confirmations will be emailed. Consult final confirmation for the judging schedule.

JUDGES ARE NOT REQUIRED TO WAIT FOR DOGS. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.



Show Site Information

Port Chester Obedience Training Club is a heated / air conditioned building. Crating space is limited; Crates only. Dogs should be crated unless they are warming up to show or are in the ring NO X-pens will be allowed. Please be considerate if trial officials ask you to consolidate to allow us to provide crating space for all exhibitors.

This is a dog training facility. Being a popular and well-used facility means it is subject to the smells and visual distractions inherent in such a facility. To the best of our ability, the ring areas are thoroughly cleaned and odors neutralized but there will likely be stains on the mats.

There are 2' by 2' pillars in our rings. Although very close, the diagram below is not 100% to scale and is included for your information.



Dogs must be on leash at all times in and outside the facility unless being shown.

Parking: Parking is available in our lot behind the facility. You may park in areas marked "loading zone" in our parking lot. There is no parking for oversized vehicles, or overnight parking on site. When the lot fills, please park on surrounding streets.

On Sunday, the two (2) hour parking limit is **NOT** enforced but there is a church across the street whose members also park on the street mid/late morning. Arrive early for the closest-to-the-facility street parking.

Set-up: There will be NO set up prior to the show hours. The building will be open at 8:00 A.M. on Sunday July 31, 2022.

Exhibitors are expected to clean up after their dogs at and around the trial site.

(Variety) if you are entering a dog of breed in which there are varieties for show purposes, please designate the particular variety you are entering, i.e., Cocker Spaniel (solid color black, ASCOB, parti-color), Beagles (not exceeding 13 in., over 13 in. but not exceeding 15 in.), Dachshunds (longhaired, smooth, wirehaired), Collies (rough, smooth), Bull Terriers (colored, white), Manchester Terriers (standard, toy), Chihuahuas (smooth coat, long coat), English Toy Spaniels (King Charles and Ruby, Blenheim and Prince Charles), Poodles (toy, miniature, standard).
- 2. (Event Class) Consult the classification in this premium list. If the event class in which you are entering your dog is divided, then, in addition to designating the class, specify the particular division of the class in which you are entering your dog, i.e, A or B division.
- 3. A dog must be entered in the name of the person who actually owned it at the time entries for an event closed.
